# The Authority of God's Word

#### Psalm 119:105

Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path.

#### 2 Timothy 3:16-17

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

### What Is Authority?

- **Definition:** Authority = the right to define, command, and establish truth.
- Question: Who or what do we ultimately trust to guide our lives?

## Competing "Authorities" in Society

- 1. Human Reason truth is what seems logical to the human mind.
- 2. Science truth is only what can be observed or measured.
- Culture / Society In society, truth is defined by majority opinion, trends, or laws.
- 4. Personal Experience / Feelings truth is what feels right to me.
- 5. Religious Pluralism all religions equally contain fragments of truth.

# The Authority of God's Word

- Inspired Authority "All scripture is given by inspiration of God" (2 Tim 3:16).
  - The Bible is *God-breathed*, not merely human wisdom.

- **2. Sufficient Authority –** "Profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (v.16).
  - The Word is enough for faith and practice; it doesn't need to be supplemented by worldly truth systems.
- 3. Practical Authority "Thy word is a lamp...a light" (Ps. 119:105).
  - The Word guides decision-making, morality, and identity.
- **4. Final Authority –** The Scriptures judge all other "truth claims." **(John 17:17 "Thy word is truth").**

## **Contrasting the Word with Other Authorities**

- Reason: valuable but fallen (Romans 1:21). Scripture renews the mind (Rom 12:2).
- **Science:** reveals God's creation but cannot explain the ultimate meaning. The Word provides purpose and moral boundaries.
- Culture: ever-changing; God's Word is unchanging (Isaiah 40:8).
- Experience: subjective; the Word interprets experiences truthfully (Jer. 17:9 vs. Psalm 19:7–8).
- Pluralism: Scripture proclaims exclusive truth in Christ (John 14:6).
